Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of this half-term, I am pleased to say that the children have truly settled into their classes, they are embracing new learning with enthusiasm and gaining lots of new knowledge and skills along the way.

Thank you to all the parents who attended the parent-teacher meetings; we hope they provided a clear picture of your child's strengths and their next steps in learning. Please remember that if you have any concerns or worries about your child then you do not have to wait until the next meeting, you can make an appointment to see your child's class teacher at any time during the year.

Our Curriculum meetings were well attended this year. One of the key messages in all of our curriculum evenings was the importance of reading. Reading is a fundamental skill that opens the door to all areas of the curriculum. When children develop strong reading abilities, they are better equipped to access and understand subjects ranging from science to history, and even mathematics. It builds comprehension, expands vocabulary, and fosters a love for learning.

We cannot stress enough how crucial it is for children to read regularly, both at school and at home. Parents play a vital role in supporting this by reading with their child as often as possible. Sharing a book together not only strengthens their reading skills but also encourages a positive attitude towards learning. Our school's reading motto is "Strive for 5," which means we encourage every child to read with an adult at least five times a week. This small commitment can make a big difference in your child's progress and confidence as a reader. Just a reminder that every time your child reads at home with a grown-up they can write their name on a raffle ticket in school. Each half term a winner will be chosen in Celebration Assembly to receive a lovely new book.

### **Scooting Stars**

After half term (on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> November) we will be holding a Learn to Scoot session called Scooting

STARS, with Wirral Council's Road Safety team. This will be a chance for the children in F2, Yr1 and Yr2 to practise balancing, braking and general handling skills through a series of fun games.

Children will need to bring their scooter and a helmet into school with them to be able to take part. It is important that all scooters are in good working order.

### This means:

- good working brake(s).
- working wheels.
- a frame with no cracks on the welded joints.
- deck tape.
- secure handlebars, bar ends and bar <u>plugs</u>.

I am letting you know now so that you can check your child's scooter over the holidays. If your child does not have a scooter then they will be able to use a school scooter.

I will send a letter out after the holiday for you to give consent for your child to take part.
