

## **Behaviour Policy**

The Department for Education has released new guidance on managing behaviour in school. Our school Behaviour Policy is reviewed annually and has been updated to reflect this new guidance. For us there were few changes that needed making. The policy has been placed on the school website and any comments from parents/carers are welcomed.

Fundamentally, our approach is that everyone in school should be treated kindly, feel safe and respected. We praise and reward good behaviour choices in many ways. If wrong behaviour choices are made then there is a consequence and this will ordinarily mean missed Golden Time or playtime. If your child has missed Golden Time then you will receive a yellow slip home that outlines the behaviour that occurred. Children will always receive a warning to change their behaviour before their Golden coin is removed. If a child is regularly losing their Golden Time or seriously breaching our behaviour policy then parents will be contacted by a member of school staff.



## **Assemblies**

In assembly we deal with lots of important themes and the children understand that there is always a special message. This term we have focused on understanding why we have rules, inclusion, respect, equality and democracy (voting for our School Parliament members).

October is Black History Month and the children have found out about people from history who have made a significant contribution to our world.
