Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you had a good half term. The children have now well and truly settled into their classes and we have been impressed with how enthusiastically they are approaching their learning. I hope that you find our weekly homework sheet useful in starting conversations with your child about what learning has taken place during the week. Talking about their learning at home will help embed the key knowledge from lessons.

Thank you to all those parents/carers who attended our Curriculum Evenings a couple of weeks ago. The meetings were well attended and we have received lots of positive feedback about the information presented.

One of the key messages in all of our curriculum evenings was the importance of reading and how our reading system has altered slightly. In line with advice from our Literacy Consultant, the phonics book (Big Cat) that your child brings home will be the book that they have read already in school three or four times with a trained adult. Your child should be confident and fluent reading this book. Just a reminder that every time your child reads at home with a grown-up they can write their name on a raffle ticket in school. Each half term a winner will be chosen in Celebration Assembly to receive a lovely new book.

External Review of Governance

In my last newsletter, I described that we were having an external review of leadership and governance by the National Governors' Association. This review was commissioned by Wirral Local Authority. Here is a summary of the key findings from the report:

This is a board which cares deeply for the school and the community it serves. Governors have a very good understanding of their school, their role, and how the school can support the pupils and the community. They appear to know the school, its strength and weaknesses very well.

Meetings are well planned, clearly structured, and well chaired by a chair who is skilled, experienced, and professional. Relationships are constructive, positive, and professional and the clerk effectively supports the board and enables excellent governance at the school.

Governors have worked in partnership with the headteacher to make rapid and sustained improvements to governance, and the leadership of the board by the chair and headteacher has driven this improvement whilst strengthening already positive relationships within the board and with the school staff.

Safeguarding and Online Safety

As part of our curriculum (computing and PSHE) we teach the children about safety online. The children learn at an age-appropriate level about what they should and should not do when using technology. In assembly recently, we have raised children's awareness of bullying including cyber bullying.

The NSPCC provides lots of great advice for parents on lots of topics including online safety. The leaflet attached with this newsletter is particularly helpful to help parents understand how to keep their child safe online.

Special Educational Needs

A new website publicising the 'local offer' of support options for young people with special educational needs has launched on the Wirral.

The 'SENDLO' website (standing for SEND Local Offer) will share the most relevant, up-to-date and easily accessible information with families across the borough.



Co-produced with parents, young people and a range of partners the new website has been developed to raise awareness of the SEND local offer in Wirral and signpost families to the support and services they need.

Mrs McLeod, as many of you know, is our school Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator. Mrs McLeod has written the following information for parents/carers.

If your child has been referred to Speech and Language, the 0-19 service or the Neurodiversity Team, here is a brief update on waiting times. The waiting lists for children to be seen by a speech and language therapist are currently very long. The waiting list for children under 5 for speech and language is up to two years.

For those children being referred to the ADHD, ASD and DCD pathway, again the waiting lists are long to see a paediatrician. There are currently over 2000 children on these pathways across Wirral.

Once your child's referral has been triaged by the 0-19 team or the neurodiversity team you should receive a letter to say if they have/haven't been accepted on the pathway. If accepted on the pathway then the letter will outline the next steps for your child.

NHS Leaflet

Attached to this newsletter is a summary from the NHS which outlines when you should keep your child off school and for how long. Please note that we have seen a rise in school of skin infections and I would advise parents/carers to get any open sores on the skin checked out before sending your child to school.
