Consultation on the School Day

The Department for Education has set out a minimum expectation of at least 32.5 hours for the length of the school week in primary schools by 1st September 2023. This means that we currently fall short of this expectation by twenty-five minutes. I therefore plan to extend the school day by five minutes from September 2023. School finishing time will move from 3.05pm to 3.10pm.

Trophies

In our weekly celebration assembly we give out trophies to children. Unfortunately, many of our trophies have not been returned and we are now missing some. I would be grateful if you could check at home whether you have any of our trophies and return them to school as soon as possible so other children can experience the delight of receiving one.

Local Authority Visit

On 6th March we had a visit from two Local Authority inspectors. They spent the day in school observing lessons, talking to staff about our curriculum and reviewing children's books. Strengths were identified and also areas for us to focus on so that we keep improving what we provide for our children. It was a good opportunity for us to evidence the progress that has been made since our last inspection especially in the development of reading/phonics and the school curriculum.

<u>RNLI Visit</u>

RNLI volunteers from West Kirby Lifeboat station visited school last week. They gave an engaging presentation to the children in assembly about their role and they told us how they are raising money for a new lifeboat. Each class then had the chance to see the lifeboat and they even got to climb on board the boat! It was a lovely experience for them. Who knew that the tractor is the only one used in the UK?

I cannot thank the team enough for the visit to school and for the kindness and patience they demonstrated with the children. Thank you for all of the donations received. It is not too late to donate to this extremely worthwhile cause and we will keep the ParentPay option open until the end of term.

<u>Art</u>

Inspirational Speakers

Even though our children are young we feel that it is important to provide them with the opportunity to hear about different careers and jobs that people have. We know that many of our school community have interesting jobs and hobbies. If you can spare half an hour to come and talk to the children then we would love to hear from you.

Statutory Assessment of Pupils in Year 1 and 2

Many of you will already know that the Government require all Year 1 children to sit a statutory phonic screening check. The screening this year will take place during the week commencing 12th June 2023.

The screening check is designed to confirm whether children have learnt phonic decoding to an appropriate standard. Our children are familiar with such phonic assessments so this should not cause any distress. Parents/carers will receive the results in the end of year report.

<u>Year 2</u>

During May, assessment tests will be administered to Year 2 pupils. Our Year 2 teachers will share at parent/teacher meetings ways in which you can support your child to achieve the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.

The test will be incorporated into normal classroom practice so we hope the children will be unaware that the assessments are taking place. We would be grateful if parents/carers also do not focus too much of their child's attention on these assessments because they form only a small part of the child's assessment profile. Once completed our teachers will use the Key Stage 1 test results to help them to reach an overall judgement of the standards children have reached in English Reading, English Writing and Mathematics. You will also receive a teacher assessment judgement for Science, but there is no formal science assessment. You will receive this information in your child's end of year report.
