What a wonderful week! Once again, we would like to personally welcome you and your child into Year 1 at Black Horse Hill Infant School. We are pleased that the children have settled well into the beginning of the school year and are confident that they will have a happy time in Year 1. We are really enjoying getting to know your children.

This week we have been writing sentences about what we did during the Summer holidays. We have also been practising reciting the letters of the alphabet and playing lots of games to read and spell words.

In Maths, we have been practising our counting and writing our numbers.

In History we have been learning about the different stages of life of humans e.g. baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult, elderly.

In Science we have started learning all about humans. We have introduced the term mammal. We have been talking about the different parts of the body and have labelled the different parts of the body as a class.
