### Parking

There is an increasing number of parents/carers using the school and Annexe car park to drop off children at the beginning and end of the school day. This is causing difficulties for staff members who start around this time to get into the school car park. From now on our school gates will be closed daily and only those people who have a prior arrangement with school will be allowed access. Sadly, I have recently received a couple of complaints from some of the residents and other parents who have reported that parents/carers have been parking across driveways and driving inconsiderately. Please park safely and respectfully when dropping off and collecting your children from school.

The Health Protection Agency guidance, which we follow, says that 48 hours should pass after the last bout of sickness before a child should return to school. Keep reinforcing good hand washing techniques at home to keep those bugs and viruses at bay!

## Lost Property

I know how frustrating and expensive it can be when children lose things at school. Our children are encouraged to look after their property and place jumpers, cardigans etc on their pegs. In assembly we have spent time modelling how to keep hats, gloves and scarves together to prevent them getting lost. Unavoidably, items do end up in the Lost Property Box and at the moment it is overflowing. It is impossible, however, to return lost items to children if they don't have a name in. ## Attendance and Punctuality

Every day in school can make a difference to a child's future, which is why regular and high attendance in school is vital.

The #EveryDayCounts campaign is a council and partner campaign to improve school attendance in Wirral to achieve better outcomes for children and young people.

Wirral Council, along with a number of partner agencies, community organisations and schools are working together to encourage parents to do all they can to encourage regular attendance, or speak out if they need advice or support.

The benefits of regular school attendance includes:

- learning and exploring a variety of subjects and topics
- chance of making friends
- gaining skills for life that create opportunities to succeed and enjoy life in adulthood
- higher chance to gain qualifications
- positive impact on mental and physical well-being

Next week you will receive your child's attendance report for the term. Here is a quick reminder of what it means. **Green = Good—96% attendance or above**, **Amber = Cause for concern 90-95.9% attendance** and **Red = Serious concern—Below 90% attendance**. Attendance will be reviewed and parents of those children with attendance below 90% will be invited to a meeting next term. I do understand that some children have been ill this term and this will be considered when reviewing all attendance.

Thank you to all our parents and carers who ensure that their child is in school on time in the morning. This means that your child starts the day positively, in the right frame of mind for quality learning, hearing the key morning messages from the class teacher. **Please note if children are late more than 10 times after registers have closed a Fixed Penalty Notice (£60) may be issued to parents/carers.**

Occasional lateness is also acceptable when collecting children at the end of the school day. We fully understand that parents/carers may get stuck in traffic or that there is an unforeseen circumstance. However some parents/carers are regularly late and teaching staff are waiting up to 15 minutes for some children to be collected at the end of the school day. As it is becoming an issue it was discussed at one of our Governors' meetings and a decision was made that if children are regularly not collected on time, a letter will be issued to parents and if there is no improvement then children will be collected by our Out of School Club and parents will be charged a late collection fee. **School finishes at 3.05pm.**
