Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year!

This week in English, we read *Hermelin* by Mini Grey – a story about a detective mouse who discovers he is a pest, and despite his helpful nature, is distraught that the residents of his street do not want him there. During the week, we wrote questions and reinforced that questions are type of sentence that requires a response. We also discussed how a question sentence is not punctuated with a full stop but a question mark.

In Maths, we have been learning about place value but this time focussing on numbers up to twenty. We have introduced the children to the numbers between ten and twenty. We have spent the week focussing on counting forwards and backwards, understanding the term digit, as well as representing these numbers in a variety of different ways. The children have learned that we can represent these numbers as tens and ones i.e. seventeen is made of one ten and seven ones. Twenty is made of two tens and zero ones.
