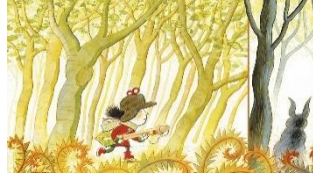


Year 1 Homework

Dear Parents and Carers,

In English, we have continued our learning linked to the text 'The Last Wolf' by Mini Grey. This week the children have explored the key features of a hunting narrative. They have also been finding specific features within our example text called 'Wolf Hunting'. The children then used this learning to plan their own hunting narrative ensuring they used features of our stories we have read. Such features include: sentence openers, alliteration, adjectives, use of 'and' as a conjunction as well as in a list, questions and sentences punctuated with exclamation marks to show strong emotion. As a way of practising this, the children wrote a character description of Little Red.

In Maths, we have continued our learning about place value to 100. This week the children have learnt about one more and one less of a range of numbers. They have had to give reasoning for how they know this. Following on from that the children then compared different numbers using greater than, less than and equal to. The children used reasoning such as '56 is greater than 49 as it has a greater amount of tens'. We revisited the inequality symbols as a way of comparing numbers.
