Reading

I make no apology for starting my newsletter with a spotlight on reading because it is so very important that we get all our children enjoying books and being able to read by the time they leave our school. To be successful readers our children need to practise reading regularly both in school and at home. It is for this reason that I ask you to make reading with your child one of your resolutions for 2024. Ideally, children should read every evening but *"Strive for 5" (Five reads a week)* would be extremely beneficial. Don't forget to write in your child's reading diary every time they read at home so they can receive a ticket to be entered into our reading raffle at the end of the half-term. If you need some advice about reading at home with your child then please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher. There are also guidance and videos on this site which are linked to the accredited phonics/reading scheme we use at school.

Mr Hamm will be delivering an assembly to the children on his personal experiences and journey to the England team. Mr Hamm's class will be taught by Mrs Astbury in his absence.

Parent Workshops

You may recall that in the Autumn Term we asked parents/carers about information that they would find beneficial to understand the learning that takes place in school. We received forty responses to the survey with many parents/carers requesting more information on how we teach maths. Overwhelmingly the best time to deliver presentations was in the evening. This term we will be running a Maths Workshop for all our BHHIS parents/carers on **Monday 4th March at 5pm** so please save the date. The presentation will be useful for all year groups.

Attendance and Punctuality

Securing good school attendance for all children continues to be a priority for us as a school. You will have received your child's attendance certificate for the Autumn Term. Pleasingly, our attendance figures were positive for the Autumn Term with a significant number of children achieving a 100% attendance certificate in our final Celebration Assembly. As a Local Authority school we work closely with an attendance officer who monitors our whole school attendance and the attendance of individual children.

Here is a reminder of school opening and closing times. Doors open **for all classes at 8.40am** (except F1 which is 8.45am). The doors will remain open until 8.55am and then the doors will be closed. Registers will be taken at 8.55am and any child arriving after 9am will be marked as late (L) in the register. In line with recommendations from the Department for Education (DfE), registers will close at 9.15 a.m. If children arrive after this time, they will be recorded as having arrived after closure of registers (code U). This counts as an unauthorised absence for that session. If children are late on ten or more occasions then a Fixed Penalty Notice may be issued.

Please ring the school office if your child is going to be late and our office staff will arrange for your child's entrance door to be opened. Late children should not access school via the school office.

School finishes for all children at 3.10pm (F1 3pm). If you are going to be late collecting your child from school then please let us know so that we can provide reassurance to your child.

Learning does begin for children from 8.40am. If your child is in early they will receive more learning! Do try and get your children into school as early as possible so that they can benefit from our morning activities.

Rainy Day bags

A rainy day bag is used in school when the weather is too bad to play outside. It contains a small number of toys/resources that your child brings in from home that they can play with during

playtimes. If your child hasn't got their own rainy day bag in school please can you send one in. Ask your child's class teacher if you are unsure about the contents. You may also want to ask your child to bring their bag home to replenish or replace some of the toys.

PE days for this half-term

On PE days children should come to school dressed in PE kit. Our school PE kit is a white, plain t-shirt, navy or black shorts/joggers/leggings and a dark coloured hoody/zip up or school sweatshirt. Football kits should not be worn.
